VETERAN'S DAY HOLIDAY

As a reminder, all Chaska City Offices, other than the Community Center, will be closed on Friday, November 11, 2011 in observance of Veteran's Day. Regular office hours will resume on Monday, November 14 at 7:30 am.

The CCC will observe regular hours from 5:00 am to 10:00 pm. In case of emergency, call 911 or the Carver County Dispatch Center at 952-361-1231. For utility emergencies call 612-640-2848 for electric or 612-660-9651 for water and sewer.



A Veteran's Day annual celebration will be held from 7:00 to 9:00 am at Chaska Middle School West. The program will begin with a flag-raising ceremony at the entrance to CMSW, followed by a program in the gymnasium with student speeches and patriotic music performed by the CMSW band.

On Friday evening, a hockey game featuring The Minnesota Warriors, made up of disabled military veterans, will take place against NHL alumni.

Daughters of the American Revolution will sing the National Anthem and the Poseiden Division of the Sea Cadets will be the color guard. The game is scheduled to begin at 7:15 pm at the Community Center arena. Cost is \$5 for adults and \$3 for students. Seniors and children under age 6 are free.
