DON'T PANIC!

At the Monday, March 21st City Council meeting, the Council will consider the approval of a Resolution that would officially declare a State of Emergency for the impending flooding we expect. The purpose of the State of Emergency is solely procedural, in order to allow the City of Chaska to begin logging any expenses related to a potential flood event so that we can be reimbursed by FEMA.

As we shared in the past, the City of Chaska is very well prepared for a flooding event. We have a certified levee protecting the City to a 500-year flood level, which is six feet above the 1965 record level. While we are well protected, there are a number of housekeeping items that we need to complete to be sure that all of our flood protection equipment and facilities are working properly. We also have to go through the process to reclaim Athletic Park after a flood, as that is the only City property in the flood plain.

Again, declaring an emergency is simply procedural and does not mean that we expect any major issues during the flooding season. If you have any questions regarding this issue, please feel free to contact the Chaska City Administrator, Matt Podhradsky, at 952-448-9200.

SPRING ROAD RESTRICTIONS IN PLACE

Residents and contractors are reminded that spring road restrictions were put into place on Monday, March 14th. Roads that are restricted to certain weights are flagged throughout the City. Limitations are typically no more than five tons on restricted roadways and are generally lifted by mid-May, when thawing is complete.
