CHRISTMAS COMES EARLY!

Christmas will come early this year! It falls on Saturday, May 11th for five excited homeowners in the City of Chaska. Approximately 200 volunteers will be needed to assist with renovations on the five single-family homes. Each site will be assigned about five skilled workers and a project manager. Numerous unskilled volunteers are also needed. Various work needs to be completed, and includes everything from scraping and painting, wallpaper removal, re-sealing of a roof, deck repairs, removal of concrete, and general maintenance and landscaping.

Volunteers should meet at Guardian Angels gymnasium at 7:30 am for a continental breakfast and to receive their work assignments, and any tools and equipment. Lunch will also be provided. Projects should be completed by about 4:00 pm. Come for all of the day or part of the day! It is recommended that volunteers register ahead of time by calling 952-361-5350 so organizers can plan for food and work locations.



Also of note, Chaska Firemen sent out notices to all residents on the west side of Highway 41 and south of Co Rd 61 that they will be checking batteries and replacing old smoke alarms free of charge to homeowners in the designated area, as a part of Christmas in May.
